Following Jesus' death?

What did Jesus do after His death? (I Peter 3:18 - 20)

Intro: This time frame in Christ's life remains a mystery to many folks. However, there are enough Scriptures to give us an idea as to Christ's activities following His death, burial and resurrection. And Christ is not on vacation in heaven idle or taking a breather. Christ is busy and active on behalf of the Redeemed of the Lord.

Some of the things the Bible shares on this subject.

I. In our source text we see that Jesus to those who died during the flood in the
days of Noah!
A. Those who died in the flood, died because they chose not to believe God's messenger,
Noah. (<mark>Genesis 6:1 – 3</mark>)
B. Let's unwrap these Bible verses:
1. In Genesis 6:3, God was warning earth's inhabitants of a judgment.
2. In I Peter 3:18 – 20, the word 'sometime' means afore time or'
3. Let this sink in – only of the earth's population survived that judgment.
4. We know from other passages that once an individual dies there is a of

2. Then to the disciples – John 20 19 – 25.	
3. Eight days later, to the disciples, this time Thomas was present – John 20:26 – 31.	
4. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus $-$ Luke $24:13-33$.	
5. Appearing to above five hundred – I Corinthians 15:1 – 6.	
6. Appeared by the sea shore in John 21:1 − 24.	
7. There was a meeting in Galilee foretold – Matthew $28:16 - 18$.	
8. A meeting with His half-brother James – I Corinthians 15:5 – 7.	
9. Jesus' ascension to heaven – Matthew 28:18 – 20; Acts 1:4 – 5.
