Is it O Kay to have more than one wife? (Romans 4:15.)

Intro: Now this might seem an odd place to start this biblical discussion seeing that the Old Testament and the New Testament seem to have two distinct differences on this subject. We have what appears to be an acceptable practice in the O. T. where it wasn't uncommon for a man to have two or more wives. Even those who like David known to a man after God's own heart – (Acts 13:21 & 22), God knew the life of David from beginning to end, that he would one day have about seven wives. Solomon with 700 wives and 300 concubines, Samuel's father had two wives. None of this seemed to deter God from using them in His grand scheme of all things. Yet, in the New Testament we find pastors, elders and deacons were to have only one wife! So, what are the facts?

E. God is going to be very about some of the things He seemed to be lackadaisical
in the O. T.
1. The question was raised in the N.T (Matthew 19:5 - 11)
2. In the O.T. divorce was over incompatibility, however in the N.T. it
was only permitted due to adultery.
3. The point being that when the N.T. was completed, God was able to tell the rest of the
story, or how things be. Polygamy was definitely, monogamy was;
no simple cause acceptable for divorce save
4. If one can believe that with 700 wives and 300 concubines that Solomon didn't have
his share of, physically and spiritually, read I Kings 11:1 – 9.
5. God is clear that Elders/pastors are to have only wife - I Timothy 3:2 – 12.
6. Paul writes at the behest of God in Titus 1:6.
F. It actually appears that from the beginning God meant for any man to have more
than one wife or one woman to have multiple husbands.
1. The Morman's are not even a Christian group of people, rather a cult, and
