- A. His death was to reveal the power and the promise of His second Coming – John 14:1 – 6.
1. He is coming again to _____ this world of all the wicked. Zechariah - Zechariah 13:1-10 (Matthew 24:4 – 24; Jude verses 15 – 20)
 2. He is coming to cleanse the world of the wickedness which the wicked have done and are doing.
- B. The world more strangely and strongly today, feels it does not need Christ nor His righteous ways.

1. This will change just prior to His Second Coming.

IX. He died to _____ us He is all we will ever need. (Alpha and Omega) Revelation 1:8.

- A. The old IBM 80 column card was not a new approach to convey information.
1. The idea was used in looms for rugs and other materials.
 2. IBM developed a way for machinery to turn punched holes into electronic information.
 3. This IBM 5081 card had three zones at the top and numbers 1-9 in a column and there were 80 such columns. Key punch operators punch holes using a key punch machine to be fed into computers or unit record equipment. It was basically how all the information in the world was stored and placed into computers.
- B. In the person of our Lord Jesus Christ we have all the _____ and _____ necessary to survive in this world, regardless of our circumstance and decisions we need to make. He is Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end.
- C.
